Suggested Boy Scout Camp Packing List:

LABEL EVERYTHING, all gear & personal items with name & troop 51. Plan ahead & Be PREPARED for the weather.

Do NOT pack food or snacks in gear bag!

Bring Day of Departure:

- Cell phone & charger (will be left with scout master all week)

We stop for lunch on the way to camp, and the way home from camp. If scout does not have a debit card, please bring two envelopes with cash for these meals. Label Scout Name, and "TO" or "HOME" and give to lead adult going to camp at departure.

There is also a trading post/snack shop at camp the scouts like to visit. Scouts will manage their own cash brought for the trading post.

- Wear swim suit (Swim tests are done immediately upon arrival and you will not have access to your packed gear to pull out your swimsuit.)
- Wear Scout Class A Shirt

to/from camp on your trustworthy, loyal, helpful, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent body

Packed for Gear Check: Pack your stuff in*:

O 2 Plastic storage bins Pack all gear & clothing. The bins help keep gear clean & dry & accessible. In a perfect world, all bins will be uniform size for ease of packing the trailer. Ideal containers are Rubbermaid Roughneck 10 or 18 gallon size. Easy to get from various places. Especially Office Max or Home Depot.

○ 1 Duffle with 3 Plastic garbage

bags Pack pillow & sleeping bag in garbage bag, in duffel. Have 2 extra garbage bags in duffle for repacking at end of camp.

*If you don't have/can't get storage containers or a large duffel, that's ok. Those are preferred/suggested, but not required.
